



Cranberry Rough & Hockham Fen

On the Northwestern edge of the parish lies a boggy and dangerous area of "hoverland", referred to as Hockham Fen and Cranberry Rough. Today it is managed by Norfolk Wildlife Trust under ownership of the Trust and the Forestry Commission, but the fen once belonged to the Fuel & Furze Charity, who sold it to the then Norfolk Naturalists Trust in the 1960's. The charity retained the sporting rights, and occasionally invited guests are allowed to try and shoot wildfowl or the occasional pheasant there. Strict rules apply, but rights need to be exercised from time to time, as long as wildlife is fully respected. Nothing's been shot for 20 years!

The Rough and Fen were the site of Hockham Mere, one of the largest meres in Breckland in its day, which is mentioned in Francis Blomefield's History of Norfolk as;

Hocham Meare, alias Cranberry Fen, is a separate water of the lords of this manor; (Rolls 7. 10 H. 7. 13. 22 H. 8. 16 Eliz.) it contains fourteen score acres, and is in circuit 708 perches, every perch containing 18 feet, and the lord hath a fish-house there.

The fish house is mentioned in a number of old documents, and the area was a good fishery in Tudor times with boats and nets at the fish house. The occasional person was convicted for stealing fish and a swannereve was employed there as swans were the property of the royal family and so well protected.

On the edge of the mere, several finds of flint implements have been made and recorded, particularly Mesolithic finds of worked flints and debitage, plus the occasional palaeolithic find.

Cranberry Rough is so called because natural cranberries used to grow there among with Royal fern, though I know of no one who has located these species in recent years, albeit as mentioned the terrain and bog is treacherous.

Hockham Fen is used as core base data from a series of core samples taken by Godwin and Tallintire in the 1940's and 50's and there is a published paper by H.D Bennett from 1983 called *Devensian Late-Glacial and Flandrian Vegetational History At Hockham Mere, Norfolk England*. More recently Sheffield University have taken further core samples and both John Craven and Ray Mears have visited the area.

In the centre of Cranberry Rough, there are some amazing mosses, lichens and vegetation, almost primeval in their looks, but one wrong step and you disappear into several feet of mud and would likely never get out.

A booklet in the 1930's by Mosby, gives detailed information about the fens make up and history and the rare vegetation and insects inspired Ted Ellis the well known Norfolk Naturalist, to fall in love with the fen and its flora and fauna, it was one of his favourite places and he regularly wrote about his findings in EDP articles of the 1970's and 80's.
