Churchwarden's Letter

At the time of writing this letter the Wayland Group of churches is in the process of celebrating Harvest in each of our parishes. Although harvest festivals go back to pagan times, as a Christian festival Harvest first made its appearance in England in the Middle Ages in the form of a Catholic service of Lammas from the Old English *hlafmaesse* meaning "loaf mass", held on what was commonly called Loaf Mass Sunday. Traditionally on 1st August, it was a celebration to mark the first fruits of the harvest, a loaf of bread being brought into church for a blessing which was then used for communion.

However, by early Victorian times the celebration of harvest was no longer a Christian church service but rather an opportunity for the farmers and their workers to indulge in Harvest Supper merriment after their

labours. On 8th September 1854 the Rev'd Dr William Beal, Rector of Brooke, Norfolk held a formal Harvest Festival in his church aimed at ending what he described as "disgraceful scenes" at the end of harvest.
- One can only imagine what he saw!

But we owe the modern form of harvest festival to a rather eccentric Victorian vicar, the Revd Robert Hawker, Rector of Morwenstow in Cornwall. Stories about his eccentricities were legion, including his dressing up as a mermaid, keeping a pet pig and walking round his parish with it on a lead, and excommunicating his cat for killing a mouse on a Sunday! His domestic life was equally unusual in that he married a mature lady of 41 when he was 19 and following her death he married for a second time at the age of 60, this time to a girl of 20! He finally, and somewhat unexpectedly, converted to Catholicism on his deathbed.

As I said, Rev'd Hawker is credited for establishing the modern British tradition of celebrating Harvest Festivals in churches after he invited parishioners to a special thanksgiving service for the Harvest in October 1843 and thus began the services we are familiar with today.

Incidentally, Rev'd Robert Hawker has another claim to fame as he wrote the unofficial Cornish national anthem – The Song of the Western Men – still sung in Cornwall's pubs and at rugby matches and especially on St Piran's Day, Cornwall's National day on 5th March. Strangely, there is a tenuous link in the song to Great Hockham. The anthem's chorus line is

*"And shall Trelawny live or shall Trelawny die?
Here's twenty thousand Cornish men shall know the
reason why!"*

The 'Trelawny' referred to is the Cornishman Sir Jonathan Trelawny, Bishop of Bristol, who, along with six other Anglican Bishops including the Archbishop of Canterbury was imprisoned in the Tower of London in 1688 by order of King James II for refusing to read out a proclamation in their churches to remove legal restrictions on Catholics and Nonconformists. Those Bishops were prosecuted for seditious libel but were eventually acquitted following a notorious trial in which the lead prosecuting Counsel happened to be one Sir Robert Baldock, Lord of the Manor of Great Hockham and who is buried in Hockham churchyard!

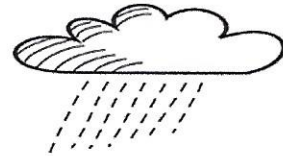

Charity Shooting Rights

Hockham Town Lands Charity is seeking bids for the shooting Rights on its land for the season commencing 2nd February 2024 to 1st February 2026 with an option to extend for a further 3 years to 1st February 2029.

The area of land in question is approximately 16.7 acres (6.75 ha) and is situated on the West side of the B1111 between Shropham Road and Harling Road.

The Shooting Rights are to be let under the British Association for Shooting and Conservation (BASC) model agreement. Applicants must have a current BASC membership and have public liability insurance to the value of £10 million.

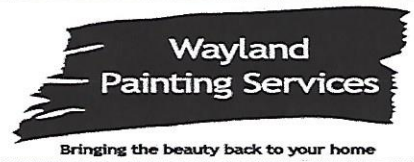

PAKISTAN... Working in Taliban country!!!

Since the work went well in Nigeria, other work came my way, with trips to many different countries not least several to Pakistan, building a power station close to Lahore, so with all that behind me I was at home and the phone rang...would I do another trip to Pakistan, yes I said, not knowing where or when, but work was work.

I received an Email which said "Go to Pakistan Embassy and get a visa". That was strange as normally all that was done for us? and here is your itinerary, which was London – Lahore, then internal flight, the tickets will be given to you in country! You're heading for Balochistan???...

So to the Embassy in London, which as normal was chaos, but standing in line waiting I struck up a conversation with two Pakistan ladies, they asked 'where are you going? I replied Balochistan to which they said "oh my father rides his horses there". My mind then thought grass, open plains, trees, hedges...horses in fields...should have known better!

Arrived in Lahore and to an Airport Hotel, there I was greeted with Tickets to "Quetta"...oh dear I thought. Anyway caught the flight next morning and arrived in Quetta to be met by what can only be described as a Militia. There outside the terminal were four vehicles: a car, two open back Toyota Pickups with heavy machine

guns and an open back truck with six what looked like terrorists in the back with two RPG's and AK47 assault rifles!!! This was my escort to a place called Gulistan near to Afghanistan.

The next approx. four hours were probably the most horrendous journey I have taken up to that point in my life. First we were at breakneck speed given the conditions; second, my minder in the car was a devout Muslim who spent most of the journey telling me about the Koran!!! Thirdly we were travelling on roads that make the Harling road look like the M25. There had been terrible flooding in the area some time ago and the area was decimated, but for my safety we sped along as fast as was not safe! And then probably the worst bit, with the car window open a bit of a smell came evident and got stronger as we progressed until it was quite sickening. Due to the floods and the loss of houses the UN had donated Tents to the displaced, and these were in refugee camps and the sanitation must have been nonexistent! And we came across several camps during the journey and each one announced itself before I could see it!

Then came the harsh reality of survival in rural decimated Pakistan. A tractor with a trailer pulled in front of us even though we had blue lights flashing! Oh dear, the Militia went after the tractor, and pulled him up, dragged him off his tractor and beat him quite badly, then drove his tractor off the road leaving him bleeding profusely on the side of the road. The logic was he could use the tractor to slow us, then we get attacked by Taliban and it's good night!

I was relieved to get to our destination, an old Army camp in the middle of nowhere. Home for the next however long.

The hosts who turned out to be the Pakistan Government, showed me my room, I got some food and drink and settled for the night, my colleague arrived from the work site so had a chat with him for a while and went to bed.

Boom!! What the %\$£*(was that? I looked at my watch which was adjusted to local time, 2.00am an explosion had woken me so I expected mayhem and shouting, nothing, looked out of the window, nothing, so went back to sleep. Next morning at Breakfast we learn one of the pipelines from the site which was approx. a mile away across the desert was blown up by an RPG being fired at it, par for the course apparently! So hence no one was getting excited last night.

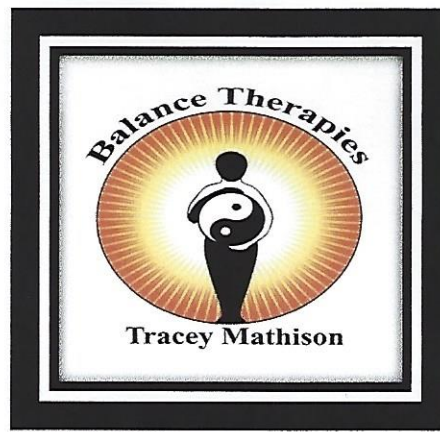
