

Tree Felling

The Parish Council would like to express its gratitude on behalf of the village to Jonathan Leech and Leech Farms, for expediting the felling of the two dead oak trees situated on the popular permissive pathway between Little Hockham Lane and the playing field.

Whilst the trees were the responsibility of the Trappes-Lomax Estate, permission was obtained for Jonathan and his team to remove them.

Hockham's History Hockham Shops

No shops now, but it wasn't always like that.

Hockham has had a number of shops over the years. The Post Office has been in two different places, in the Old Stores on the Watton Road, which also housed a general store and bakery and the original Post Office was in Alma House, also housing the village telegraph system as well as a bakery and general store.

Admiral House was once a general store run by the Currie family in the 80s and before that the Ellis and Adams families. There was a haberdashery shop on the Watton Road, a garage on Watton Road, plus another next to the Eagle, (the Eagle also had petrol pumps).

There was a fish and chip shop down Harling Road, a butcher on Harling Road and a tailors and newsagents on the corner of Vicarage Road and Watton Road, plus a bakery and Co-op stores on Watton Road. There had been at least two blacksmiths, the Watton Road Forge being the most recognisable today, which also sold bicycles at one time. There were also two shoemakers, one in Vicarage Road and another in Shropham Road.

Hockham was considered reasonably self-contained, but it was also relatively easy to cycle or take the train (Wretham and Hockham Station) to go further afield including the bright lights of Norwich.

Jo Wyatt

A huge loss has sadly befallen Great Hockham and beyond.

On 7th of February Jo Wyatt, a titan of the community, died after a short and brutal illness. Jo loved this village, and as a "RAF Brat" who had been used to moving around, Great Hockham gave her roots.

Originally from Cannock, Staffs, with stints in many places including a much loved Barry, South Wales and Teacher Training College in Cambridgeshire, Jo moved to Norfolk after meeting a dashing young farmer from Snetterton.

Her first taste of where was to be home was in the early to mid 70s when she came to the primary school on a temporary basis as she had 3 demanding and exhausting young children and a husband who worked away.

Any pupil or parent from that time may well remember her Coat of Many Colours kaftan, her ponchos or just hitching her skirt up chasing behind Mrs Pallister who in turn would be chasing after some wayward escapee pupil (you know who you are!)

This temporary basis turned into a full time career until she finally retired in the following millennium. This career was not exclusive to Great Hockham as she went on to be a highly respected member of the teaching profession excelling and advancing in the field of dyslexia around the county.

The move to the village started in the old Duck Farm on Little Hockham Lane, long before it became the lovely complex it is now. Then it was a derelict factory and a house that had been empty for some time. This was thanks to Kathy Wright whilst she found somewhere suitable.

So in 1980 Jo and kids moved to Watton Road. With one moved away to college, one in high school and the other packed off to boarding school, she could focus more on work and the village.

An important member of Holy Trinity Church, being involved for many years in many different roles, member of the parish council, a long standing driving force of the community car scheme, tour guide at Houghton on the Hill church dazzling visitors with her historic stories, tales of the witch craft and all with dramatic flair and flamboyance.

Some amazing productions were put on at the village hall with Jo bringing her Stratford Shakespearean expertise to the amateur dramatic enthusiasts. Sell outs every night, dubious gentlemen in tights, stunning Noel Coward scenes, ladies in polyester discussing the practical use of certain Anne Summers items and so much more, I'm sure the laughter was heard in the D&P in Wretham. Theme nights of music, food, wine and costumes, head banging to Meat Loaf at the village hall, New Years Day parties that had all generations ruined by the early evening and joining in with the village fetes and flower shows. Before Health and Safety started taking notice of such events Jo had most of the village beside themselves when she and a local farmer drove round the obstacle course. Why is that funny? Well, cleverly the car had everything back to front - the steering, the pedals and the gears. A roaring success.

The garage became full of dried flowers, vases, that green oasis stuff, wires and anything else that might come in artistically useful for the flower club. A lover of gardening which she continued to enjoy whilst she could. Luckily she did get to see her new driveway which she was thrilled with.

She definitely had fun and always tried to ensure those around her did too with her quick wicked wit, warmth and generosity of spirit.

The family have found comfort in the many kind messages which confirm how loved and respected she was by so many. Jo touched so many lives in her professional and personal life for which she will long be remembered, and greatly missed by all the wonderful friends she made in and around the great village of Hockham.

MINUTES OF A MEETING OF HOCKHAM PARISH COUNCIL ON MONDAY 12TH FEBRUARY 2024 AT HOCKHAM VILLAGE HALL

Attending; Councillors Bennett, Lambert, Lloyd, Thomas, Guppy, Loft and Leech, 7 members of the public and the clerk.

- 1) **Apologies for absence.** It was noted that councillors Eagle and Cowen were not present as the clerk had not invited them in error.
- 2) **Declaration of Interests;** Councillor Lambert as owner and landlord of the Eagle, Councillor Leech as a farmer at Little Hockham and councillors Bennett and Loft as allotment holders.
- 3) Requests for dispensation; None
- 4) **Minutes form January 8th 24.** These were edited for the date (6th to 8th) and approved.
- 5) Progress Report.
 - a) Litter pick. This had been successful.
 - b) Streetlights. No further progress.
 - c) Wheelchair Ramp. No further progress.
 - d) Info Board. No further progress.
 - e) Councillor Plaques. Examples were shown. The green versions were considered the best.
 - f) Website. The council were signed up. The clerk was progressing with Norfolk ALC.
 - g) Grants. The community car grant had been made. The D Day grants were being looked at outside of the parish council.
- **6) Public Participation.** The meeting was adjourned for 20 minutes for a public discussion. Items from this will be put in councillor updates.
- 7) District and County Council Reports. None, due to an invitation error by the clerk.
- 8) Highways and Road Safety. (Councillor Thomas). The drain near the village green had been repaired. Road surfacing and potholes on the Wretham Road had been reported. Hedge cutting had progressed in some places. NCC were pursuing an issue on Little Hockham Lane. The council would write to Councillor Eagle and highways over this matter.
 - The trod was discussed. It was considered the NCC Highways actions insufficient. The clerk would obtain a quote from SERCO for maintenance, albeit some councillors felt spending parish monies unacceptable, as this was highways responsibility.
 - Damaged signs on the A1075 had been replaced or reported.
 - Contractors had addressed some of the grips to avoid standing water.
 - In general village drainage was still an issue. A WhatsApp group was collating photos as evidence. The chair would write to highways.
- 9) Planning. There had been no response to the FOI letter. Moat Farm application 3PL/2023/1163/F had been approved. The Local Plan was still progressing but there were currently no items for discussion regards Hockham.
- **10) Playing Field.** It was unanimously decided that the parish council take on all responsibility and finances for the playing field. A working party would meet

- soon. The committee would consist of Councillors Lloyd, Loft and Leech plus co-opted members of the parish and the previous committee members and plans for a spend limit would be addressed at the next meeting. The clerk would progress the finances. The pedestrian entrance would be looked at. SERCO were thanked for the excellent work done on cutting back vegetation and hedges.
- 11) Finances. The current bank balance was £11501.43. Approval was given for the following payments: Clerks salary for Feb and March at £179.40; Pearce and Kemp maintenance for Feb and March at £45.60, PC Insurance £1232.67, Village Hall water and hall hire at £99 and £144; Community heartbeat Rental at £72, clerk's expenses at £133.28 and the annual Community Heartbeat Support payment when it was received. The clerk would look to progress a VAT reclaim.
- **12) Allotments. (Councillor Bennett).** The allotment under eviction had been given a good tidy up. The clerk would investigate further. Some tree maintenance had occurred.
- 13) Footpaths and Rights of Way. (Councillor Loft) Councillor Leech had completed culvert works on the Roundhouse footpath. The Illington bridge had been repaired. The Pightle footpath that had been reported was considered no problem.
- 14) **Community Climate Action.** It was decided not to progress a speaker, suggested from another parish.
- 15) **Councillor Updates.** Following public participation discussions, the following decisions were made; Councillor Leech would progress the felling of two dead oaks by the permissive path. A fence would be erected whilst this was being actioned. The council would ask the Norfolk Fire Service of their opinion on the dangers of the flammability elephant grass, which was due for cutting soon. A request to ask people to cut hedges by end Feb was agreed.

 A property identified with lots of rubbish outside would be discussed at the next meeting.
- 16) Correspondence. None.
- 17) **Date of next meeting.** Monday 18th March, which may be preceded by a public Playing Field Committee meeting.


